

ORDINANCE 2022-BC-O- 5

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE MADISON COUNTY  
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULATING THE USAGE OF  
COUNTY OWNED PARKING SPACES ON EAST NINTH STREET,  
SOUTH OF THE MADISON COUNTY GOVERNMENT CENTER**

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**WHEREAS**, the Madison County Board of Commissioners (hereafter “Commissioners”), as the executive of Madison County, retain the authority to regulate parking in county owned parking lots and parking spaces (“County Parking”); and,

**WHEREAS**, the Commissioners have previously regulated County Parking by and through Ordinance Nos. 82-BC-03, 1998-BC-O-06, and 2004-BC-O-01; and,

**WHEREAS**, after reviewing parking patterns and receiving information from county officials, the Commissioners have determined that County Parking on East Ninth Street, south of the Madison County Government Center, and between Meridian Street and Main Street, in Anderson, Indiana (the “Ninth Street Parking”) requires further regulation.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** that the following rules and regulations shall apply to the Ninth Street Parking:

1. Ninth Street Parking shall only be used by members of the public conducting business in the Madison County Government Center at 16 East Ninth Street, Anderson, Indiana.
2. On-duty Madison County employees are prohibited from utilizing the Ninth Street Parking for as long as that employee is on duty.
3. Parking in the Ninth Street Parking shall be limited to a duration of one (1) hour.


**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that the penalty for the first offense of this Ordinance shall be Ten Dollars (\$10.00), the second offense of this Ordinance shall be Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00), and all subsequent offenses of this Ordinance shall be Fifty Dollars (\$50.00); and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that the Madison County Sheriff and his agents are authorized to enforce this Ordinance by issuing citations as described herein, and to cause to have any vehicles parked in violation of this Ordinance towed and stored at the vehicle’s owner’s or operator’s expense.

This Ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days after publication as required by Indiana law.
